### Key Scripture: Mark 1:17-18 (CEB - Common English Bible)

"Come, follow me," he said, "and I'll show you how to fish for people." Right away, they left their nets and followed him.

### Old Testament Reading - Jonah 3:1-10 (Common English Bible)

The Lord's word came to Jonah a second time: <sup>2</sup> "Get up and go to Nineveh, that great city, and declare against it the proclamation that I am commanding you." <sup>3</sup> And Jonah got up and went to Nineveh, according to the Lord's word. (Now Nineveh was indeed an enormous city, a three days' walk across.)

<sup>4</sup> Jonah started into the city, walking one day, and he cried out, "Just forty days more and Nineveh will be overthrown!"<sup>5</sup> And the people of Nineveh believed God. They proclaimed a fast and put on mourning clothes, from the greatest of them to the least significant.

<sup>6</sup> When word of it reached the king of Nineveh, he got up from his throne, stripped himself of his robe, covered himself with mourning clothes, and sat in ashes. <sup>7</sup> Then he announced, "In Nineveh, by decree of the king and his officials: Neither human nor animal, cattle nor flock, will taste anything! No grazing and no drinking water! <sup>8</sup> Let humans and animals alike put on mourning clothes, and let them call upon God forcefully! And let all persons stop their evil behavior and the violence that's under their control!" <sup>9</sup> He thought, Who knows? God may see this and turn from his wrath, so that we might not perish.

<sup>10</sup> God saw what they were doing—that they had ceased their evil behavior. So God stopped planning to destroy them, and he didn't do it.

### New Testament Reading - Mark 1:14:20 (CEB)

<sup>14</sup> After John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee announcing God's good news, <sup>15</sup> saying, "Now is the time! Here comes God's kingdom! Change your hearts and lives, and trust this good news!"

<sup>16</sup> As Jesus passed alongside the Galilee Sea, he saw two brothers, Simon and Andrew, throwing fishing nets into the sea, for they were fishermen. <sup>17</sup> "Come, follow me," he said, "and I'll show you how to fish for people." <sup>18</sup> Right away, they left their nets and followed him. <sup>19</sup> After going a little farther, he saw James and John, Zebedee's sons, in their boat repairing the fishing nets. <sup>20</sup> At that very moment he called them. They followed him, leaving their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired workers.

Rev. Bill Wildhack currently serves as Stated Clerk and Temporary General Presbyter of the Presbytery of Tampa Bay. Since being ordained in 1985, he has served churches in Virginia and Florida, as an active duty Navy Chaplain in Panama and California, as a recalled or mobilized Reserve chaplain in Tampa and Bahrain after 9/11 and later in Rhode Island, Virginia, and Louisiana with both Navy and Marine Corps commands. As a drilling Reservist, he also served with Navy Seabees and the U.S. Coast Guard. In addition to degrees from Princeton Seminary, he graduated from Stetson Law in 2005 after completing summer legal internships with the Civil Rights Divison of the U.S. Department of Justice and at the Florida Supreme Court, and later served for two years as a staff attorney with Florida's Second District Court of Appeal (while also serving as a Reserve chaplain between recalls to active duty). In the last part of 2021, he attended his daughter's ordination to the ministry of Word and Sacrament and his son's installation in his second call as a pastor---both in the PC(USA).
